Dear Myers Community residents,

The University of Georgia is pleased to welcome the ESPN College GameDay broadcast to campus in advance of Saturday's 7:30 p.m. football game against Tennessee. ESPN College GameDay is a live, nationally broadcast pregame show focused on college football.

Beginning Saturday morning, full-time staff will check IDs to ensure only residents and their accompanied guests may enter buildings. We ask for your patience as it might take longer to enter the community while we conduct the verification process. For the security of the community, be mindful of who you escort into the building residents are responsible for their guests.

In addition, standard gameday protocols will still be in place:

- Locked exterior doors
- Security cameras to monitor interior and exterior spaces
- Student and full-time staff on call
- Police on call to respond to emergencies
- Lobby restrooms will be closed

Because of the scope of the show, several areas will be impacted College GameDay's presence on campus:

- Myers Quad will be limited or inaccessible Wednesday morning through Sunday morning, and you can expect some noise as the set is built
- You may see College GameDay staff and talent present throughout Myers Hall in our communal spaces beginning on Wednesday, Nov. 13
- Parking in the South Campus Deck and along Sanford Drive will be limited Wednesday through Saturday, and traffic is expected to be heavy all over campus as early as Thursday
- All Athletic Association parking restrictions still apply.
